Garden Visits

Pympne Manor, Benenden, TN17 4AR.

Wednesday, 25/04/12. By kind invitation of Miss Patricia Thoburn. This is a wonderful garden hidden away in a small valley with specimen trees and a series of ponds. Beyond the fine kitchen garden is a group of oaks, southern beech and a massive bird cherry. There is a hybrid rhododendron named after the hostess by the renowned plantsman Captain Collingwood Ingram.

The Rainbow Nursery at the Rare Breeds Centre, TN26 3RJ.

Thursday, 24/05/12. A guided tour of the nursery which is an enterprise run by the Canterbury Oast trust. Residents and staff sow, grow and sell an amazing variety of plants and produce.

Knowle Hill Farm, Ulcombe, ME17 1ES.

Wednesday, 01/08/12. By kind invitation of Mrs Elizabeth Cairns. A 1½ acre garden created on south facing slope over last 25 years. Mixed borders with tender plants, roses, lavenders, verbenas, salvias and grasses. Pool and rill enclosed in small walled garden planted with mainly white flowers. Small vegetable and herb garden.

Friday, 22/06/12. This year we will start at Gould Farm Oast, the home of Dick and Rosie Kefford. A garden with water features, an orchard and mixed borders. Then we move on to Broad Oak House where Rosalind and Tim Bull have done lots of work in the garden and the lake. Finally we visit the Old Vicarage, the garden of Kaija and Steve Bulbrook which has been extensively landscaped and replanted. Here the evening will end with wine and refreshments.

AGM and Talk Tuesday 16th October 2012.

We will hold a short AGM to elect the committee and review the reports. This is also the time to pay annual subscriptions! Following on we are fortunate to have as a guest speaker *Jane Griffiths*, an expert in composting who oversees the Garden Organics National Master Composter programme.

Frittenden Gardening Society Annual Shows.

FGS holds 2 shows a year, in the Spring and the Autumn. Entry forms and fees should be submitted by the Wednesday evening preceding the show, to allow time for organisation of vases, paperwork etc. Points are given to all placed entries and trophies awarded accordingly. In addition there are a few Open classes which can be entered on the day.

Entries must be brought to the hall between 8am and 9.45am **prompt** on the morning of the show and the hall vacated by 10am to allow judging to take place.

All trophies are perpetual and must be returned to the Show Secretary at least 3 days beforehand.

We welcome all entries and urge members to try a class. The committee are very happy to give help and advice when required.

A handy guide '**Tips for Showing**' is available free of charge to any member who would like more details on how to show vegetables, flowers and cookery exhibits. We can also loan out a copy of the RHS Horticultural Show Handbook which gives further information.
